SCOPE OF THE CONFERENCE

Environmentally induced materials problems cause a significant portion of nuclear power plant outage time and fuel immense economic and safety concerns regarding both the operation of aging light water reactors and the next-generation systems currently being designed. The purpose of this conference is to foster the exchange of ideas to address these problems and explore remedies for nuclear power plants that use water coolant.


The conference will continue to focus on the degradation of nickel base alloys, stainless steels, pressure vessel & piping steels, zircaloys, and other alloys in water environments relevant to reactor vessels and internals, steam generators, fuel cladding, irradiated components, fuel storage containers, and balance of plant components & systems.

WHO ATTENDS

The conference will be of interest to utility engineers, reactor vendor engineers, plant architect engineers, and consultants involved in design, construction, and operation of water reactors, as well as to researchers concerned with the fundamental nature of materials degradation in reactor systems, and regulators around the world.




Americans With Disabilities Act
