HOW ITT WORKS

What is a silent auction?

A silent auction is a fundraising event that is conducted by displaying items upon which participants can bid. A minimum bid is pre-determined by the auction company or the individual seller, and participants place their bids in writing. This gives participants ample time, during the event, to explore the various items available for auction and to take their time placing bids.

How do I bid on items?

Each item will have a bidding sheet with a brief description of the item, a minimum bid amount, and spaces for participants to write their names, telephone numbers, and bids. Meeting attendees can bid on as many items as they like, as often as they like. The bidding sheet will show all bids so that participants always know which bidder is in the lead and how high they need to bid in order to win an item. Participants may place several bids on the same item over the course of the event in order to win that item.

Bidding will begin at 4:00 p.m. for all meeting attendees and continue throughout the TMS & AIME Awards Ceremony and Banquet on Tuesday evening, March 17. The auction will close at 9:00 p.m., so be sure to stop back prior to the close of bidding to make sure yours is the highest bid.

How do I get my item home?

Individuals who have the highest, winning bid can arrange payment and shipping options with our auction company partner, Art a la Carte International Company. Individuals can take items with them the same evening or can work with Art a la Carte for shipment. All shipping charges (if applicable) are the responsibility of the winner. If you are unable to stay until the end of the auction, the auction company will contact you by telephone (via the number you write on the bidding sheet) to arrange payment and shipping.

Can I buy an item outright?

Some items in the silent auction may have the words "Buy Out" on the bottom of the bid sheet. This means that if you want to purchase the item immediately, you may place your bid on the last line. No other guest can bid on that item again. Please notify the person in charge or an auction assistant if you choose this option. The buy-out bidder can decide to pay for the item immediately and take it with them without waiting for the end of the auction.

What types of payment methods are accepted?

Mastercard and Visa Credit and Debit Cards, American Express, Discover Cards, cash, or personal checks made payable to Art a la Carte International Company are accepted. All sales are final.




OWN THE COMPLETE LIBRARY JOM MATERIALS FICTION COUNTDOWN
